PERSONAL WAR SKETCH
OF

Comrade Herman P. Manly

Who was born the fifth day of November A.D. 18 30 in

Erie County ~~of~~ Grien Township State of Pennsylvania

I first entered the service on the 18th day of December 1861 at Camp Reed, in Erie Court, Penn. as a private in Co. "F" 111th Pennsylvania Volunteers. My first battle was at Cedar Mountain Aug. 7, 1862, and other engagements in which I participated were:- Rappahannock Station, Second Bull Run. At Cedar Mountain four men of my company were killed, and nine wounded in about 30 minutes. At Antietam, three were killed and sixteen wounded, on September 17, 1862. I was not with the company in the latter engagement A few of my most intimate friends in the service were:- John L. Wells, Noah W. Lovelle, Logan J Dyke, Wm A. Roberts and Daniel Webster of my company. I was in the hospital in December 1862 at Frederick, Maryland, where I was discharged as a private Jan'y 5, 1863, on Surgeon's certificate of disability, and did not re-enlist.

The 1st Battle we were in, four lost their lives, nine wounded out of a muster of 33—We did not lose any more men in battle until Antietam—where we had 3 killed and 16 wounded.
