PERSONAL WAR SKETCH
OF

Comrade Patrick Clancy

Who was born the _____ day of _____ A.D. 18__36 in

Ireland County of _____ State of _____ and entered the service May 8, 1861 at La Salle, Ill. as a private in Co. "P." 23rd Ill. Inf. and was discharged at Bentor Barracks, Mo, Oct. 8, 1861 and re-enlisted same day and became a member of Co. "A." and Co. "X" consolidated of the 58th Ill. Inf, and held the rank of Sergeant and color bearer by promotion in 1863 and was finally discharged April 1, 1866 at Montgomery, Alabama, by reason of close of war.

My first Battle was Lexington Mo, and others were Ft. Donelson, Shiloh, Corinth, Ft. De Russy, Spanish Fort, Fort Blakely, Nashville, Pleasant Hill, La and Yellow Bayou and was wounded at Shiloh in 1862 by guerillas on Mississippi in March 1864 Pleasant Hill La, in 1864, and was in hospital in Jefferson Barracks Mo, 20 days. Was taken prisoner in Battle of Lexington Mo, in Sept, 1861 by Sterling Price. A few of my most intimate comrades were John Synder, Nick Murphy, John Nagel, Ed McGrath, Pat Haw, Goodwin D. Scofield.

I served nearly five years continuously, which I deem the most important event of service.
