PERSONAL WAR SKETCH  
OF

Comrade Charles W. Moore

Who was born the thirteenth day of March A.D. 18 41 in  
Wellsburg County of Brooke State of West Virginia

I first entered the service Aug. 20, 1861. at Camp Butler near Springfield Ill. as a private in Co. G 33 Illinois Inf. Served throughout as private. I was discharged October 11, 1864, at Springfield, Ill Expiration of term of service. Was transferred in January 1864 to the 99<sup>th</sup> Illinois Infantry. Was transferred to my favorite regiment in the summer of '64.

The first battle in which I was engaged was at Cotton Plant Ark. July 1862. The other engagements in which I participated were at Port Gibson May 1<sup>st</sup> 1863; Champion Hill, May 16, 1863; Black River Bridge, Miss. May 17, '63, Siege of Vicksburg, Miss May 20, '63, Siege of Ft. Esperanzois, Tex Nov 30, '63.

Was confined in hospitals at Fronton Missouri Feb '62, and at Memphis Tenn, St. Louis & Jefferson Barracks Missouri, from Jun to Sept 1863. I was never taken prisoner.

My most intimate comrades were Wm. A. Timmons, Spenew R. Wally, and Geo. L. Conkling.

The most important event of my service was under Grant at Vicksburg. I was one of two to receive the only order of thanks ever read before our regiment.
